

A YEAR IN REVIEW

The chart below is an overview of SCCF's grant making throughout each quarter. Broken down into the scholarships, SCCF grants including donor-grants, this shows how each cycle is impacting our communities.




SCHOLARSHIP NOTE:

SCCF Scholarships are paid in two semester increments, unless otherwise stated by the donor. Each student will receive their first payment in August and after submitting their required documents, the second payment is sent in early January.

SCCF GRANT CYCLE NOTE:

SCCF grant cycles run from June to August each year. With the help from volunteer committees, selections are made in late September with grant checks being presented to the nonprofits in late October and early November at each county's award ceremony.



FUND DOLLARS PER COUNTY

SCCF is a regional Foundation with many incredible local donors. While many of our donors include one or more counties in their philanthropy plan, the Foundation is excited to share the dollars set towards each specific county by families and individual donors.

Some of the funds available to the county are for scholarships, local grants, or donor-designated to specific nonprofits. SCCF ANNUAL REPORT 2023

SCCF funded 138 nonprofits for a total of \$187,807 in the 2023 annual grant cycle.

With the addition of the Leadership Grant available to Barber, Comanche and Harper counties, SCCF now has three different grant opportunities available to all seven counties and four grants that are location specific.

During the 2023 grant cycle, SCCF received a record high of 248 grant applications.

2023 GRANT CYCLE REVIEW:

SCHOLARSHIP UPDATE



In 2023, SCCF added six scholarships. This included one for Barber, two for Kingman, one for Kiowa, one for Pratt, and one available to all seven counties. This brought the total amount of scholarships held at SCCF up to 47.


The Fred and Nancy Kerr Scholarship was started in 2023 as a renewable scholarship opportunity allowing the recipient to be eligible for up to eight semesters. This scholarship is available to all students in SCCF's seven county service area and does not have any major or GPA requirements.

Looking into 2024, SCCF is excited to be adding 12 additional scholarships for Sterling High School students and two other opportunities: one for students in Stafford County and the other for any Kansas High School graduate.
